## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT JROTC

welve JCPS high schools offer Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) programs. Some things to know before considering JROTC:

- **JROTC** is a recruiting tool for the Armed Services, not career training. JCPS data shows that cadets are 15 times more likely to enlist in the military than non-cadets.
- For most cadets, JROTC only "trains" them to be privates exactly what they would be if they had never joined JROTC and had just walked into a recruiter's office after graduation.
- JROTC targets low-income youth and students of color, effectively creating a "poverty draft." (ACLU 2008)
- A national study concludes that the JROTC curriculum fails to meet accepted academic standards and serves primarily to promote military enlistment. (AFSC 1995)
- Analysis of JCPS data shows that JCPS cadets had no significant improvement in academic achievement compared with noncadets. (Gainous 2013)

- JROTC promotes authoritarian values and emphasizes rote learning over critical thinking. It teaches subjects (such as drill, military history, command structure, etc.) that have little or no impact on college or career preparedness. (AFSC 1995)
- Five hours per week of JROTC reduces the time available for arts, music and foreign languages – subjects proven to improve academic achievement and social/emotional development (Smith, Edutopia 2014)
- JROTC does not offer help to students who persistently underperform academically or who have persistent behavioral issues. JCPS data from 2011-12 show that more than 60% of JROTC students drop out or are removed from the program for poor academic performance and other reasons.
- Marksmanship training required as part of JROTC undermines JCPS' policy of zero tolerance for weapons in the schools.

Former Defense Secretary William Cohen described JROTC as "one of the best recruitment programs we could have."
